The Pastor's Creel



Dear friends,

As you are well aware, the COVID-19 virus has disrupted and changed life as we know it. Over the past nine months, I and the church leadership have been diligently doing everything within our ability to offer worship options that keep everyone connected and as safe as possible. This has been and continues to be challenging, as each new directive from Governor Wolf and Bishop Park require modifications to how we worship and do ministry.

To help simplify this process, it was decided in August to create a blended worship service, offering elements of both our traditional and contemporary services in order to offer something to all our members and constituents.

Then in September we voted to increase our allowed worship attendance from twenty-five people, as directed by the governor, to twenty five percent of our sanctuary's maximum capacity, which is eighty-five people.

From the beginning of this ordeal in March, we planned to reevaluate everything in October. After doing so, we have decided to return to three worship services beginning November 15, 2020.

We have been listening to you and have heard that, although not everyone, many of you have come to enjoy the blended worship service. Therefore, we will be offering an 8:15 traditional service, a 9:30 contemporary service and a 10:45 blended service. We will continue to require face masks, hand sanitizing and social distancing for the safety of all our beloved brothers and sisters.

Our small groups and ministries have been allowed and will continue to be allowed to meet. However, we are not at this time opening up our facilities to outside groups or rentals except for support groups. We will reevaluate this policy in the new year.

We will continue to live stream the 10:45 service for those who cannot or are not comfortable worshiping in person at this time.

Friends, I know we all would like for things to go back to "normal," to the way they use to be. And while many things will be similar, I do not think we will, or can, or even should go back to how things were. I believe this is an opportunity for us to grow and expand our understanding and vision for worship and ministry. I believe God is doing a new thing and is challenging the church to follow His lead, as we strive to reach new generations of people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The message has always been and always will be the same but the way it has been conveyed and experienced has undergone countless seasons of change, and I believe we are living into the next change.

I know change is not easy, and so I pray for you and hope you will pray for me as we journey together to where God is leading us. On behalf of myself and the church leadership, I want to thank all of you for your patience, understanding, and cooperation as we continue to confront COVID-19 and endeavor to be faithful to minister to one another and share the Gospel with those around us in word and deed.


