# Holy Week 101

Holy Week began with Palm Sunday (March 29), progresses through Maundy Thursday and Good Friday (April 1 and 2), and culminates with Easter (April 4).

Maundy Thursday is the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. The English word "maundy" comes from the Latin mandatum, which means "commandment." In John's gospel, on Jesus' last night and before his betraval and arrest, he washed the feet of his disciples and gave them a new commandment—to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34). While John does not record the institution of the Lord's Supper among the events of this night, the other Gospels do. Christians therefore mark this night with the celebration of Holy Communion.

The term Good Friday may be a corruption of the English phrase "God's Friday." It proclaims God's purpose of loving and redeeming the world through the cross of our Lord. It's "good" because God drew the world to Himself in Christ!

## Easter Season

Easter, for Christians, is not just one day, but a 50-day period. The season of Easter begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends on May 23, Pentecost Sunday (from the Greek word which means fiftieth), the day on which we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church of Christ (described in the Bible in chapter 2 of the book of Acts).

This is the most joyous season of the Christian year! We celebrate the Good News that in Christ's death and resurrection we are continually being made new by God's love and saving grace! It gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say, "Christ is risen!" We remember our baptisms and how through this sacrament we are, as stated in the liturgy, "incorporated into Christ's mighty acts of salvation." As "Easter people" we celebrate and ponder the birth of the Church, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and how we can live as faithful disciples.

# Sharing the Table

When we think about "sharing the table" in church, visions of Holy Communion come to mind. But there's an addition to that picture on Sundays at 9:30 during the contemporary worship service in our Living Water Café.

"Table talk" occurs twice during the service, adding interactive opportunities between the corporate singing and worship. Toward the beginning of the service the congregation breaks into smaller groups to share joys and concerns with those around them—in essence, a deeper dive into their lives for that given week.

After the pastor's sermon, small groups reconvene for table talk. Participants discuss what the scripture and message mean to them. Questions are provided to start and guide the conversation. Each individual brings a unique understanding of the message to the table.

These two opportunities are lead by facilitators who ensure that all are included in the conversations.

One of the more interesting questions is "What will you remember about the message next Friday?"

These opportunities have been unique additions that promote strong bonds within our congregation, as we share ourselves with each other during the sessions and keep worshiping throughout the week through emails, phone calls and texts with each other.

# 2020 Year-End Financial Report

Once again we at First UMC, Muncy, have been blessed with an outstanding year for our finances. At the end of 2020 we had these balances:

Current Expense Fund: \$21,097.96

Building Fund: \$ 1,041.12

Benevolence Fund: \$ 7,575.78

The Christmas offering of \$1,840.00 will be sent to our Susquehanna Conference's Camp and Retreat Ministry.

A decision was made at church council in March that we felt should be shared with the congregation. \$7,500 of the balance in the benevolence fund will be distributed to charitable and Christian organizations to aid them with projects and expenses in 2021. (See the article below.)

After these decisions, we had the following balance to begin 2021:

Current Expense Fund: \$21,097.96 Building Fund: 1,041.12 Benevolence Fund: 75.78 In 2020 we collected over \$648,000.00 in offerings and various donations. We'll distribute over \$73,000.00 through the benevolence fund, which is 12% of our income.
