Beginning the week of November 28, our 4-week Advent study will be "The Heart that Grew Three Sizes—finding faith in the story of the Grinch." Join us as we rediscover the gift of Advent which "comes without packages, ribbons, and bows," and find out how Christ speaks to us through our culture.


