"⁶ Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." **Philippians 4:6-7**

As we worked feverishly to save Tom's life, his wife of over 50 years watched with a peace I've never seen before. Tom had collapsed in the living room, prompting his wife to call 9-1-1. When we arrived, Tom was pulseless and breathless and we immediately began CPR. Paramedics employed their protocol of cardiac starting medications to no avail and Tom died despite our best efforts. As I spent time with his wife attempting to offer her support, she was the one supporting us, sharing that Tom was with God now, and it was alright. She and Tom were devout Christians and were sure that their eternal how was waiting for them. In that moment, I came to experience that peace "...which surpasses all understanding."

This was an opportunity for other first responders with me to experience the gift of hope – hope in eternal life. Despite the sudden loss of her husband of over one half of a century, Tom's wife demonstrated the hope of knowing that Tom was in heaven with his heavenly father, and although saddened tremendously by the human experience, she was experiencing that peace that only God can provide.

Let us pray...Dear Heavenly Father, teach us to cast away anxiety and to assume the peace that you meant for us to live in.
