As he ran, a small group of people amassed behind him. The group grew and grew but just silently ran behind him. I would like to think they were supporting him on his grief journey, in their unique way, by allowing him to just run, process his loss and heal.

In my grief journey, my church community has also quietly and caringly gathered around me in a unique way by praying for me, sending me cards, checking in on me and my family and even taking over some of my church responsibilities. I hope when you hear a statement like this, you will have a "church community" story ready to go that is a little like mine... a story of how much you needed your church community and how you counted on them to help you through a struggle in your life – how they amassed around you. I am sure you will because we share this community – a community of people who are filled with faith and are a powerful presence of Christ!
