Easter Lawn Crosses Available

A church member has generously donated Easter Lawn Crosses for any family in the church



who would like one or two. The crosses are to be displayed in your lawn from Good Friday through Eastertide to show passersby what Good Friday and Easter mean to you. The crosses should be placed in your lawn on Good Friday with the plain white side out so people passing by can see it. Then on Easter morning, the cross should be turned to display "He Is Risen." The cross should be removed on the Saturday before Pentecost (May 18th) and saved for future years. The crosses will be available in the narthex and outside the Living Water Café this Sunday, March 17th.
